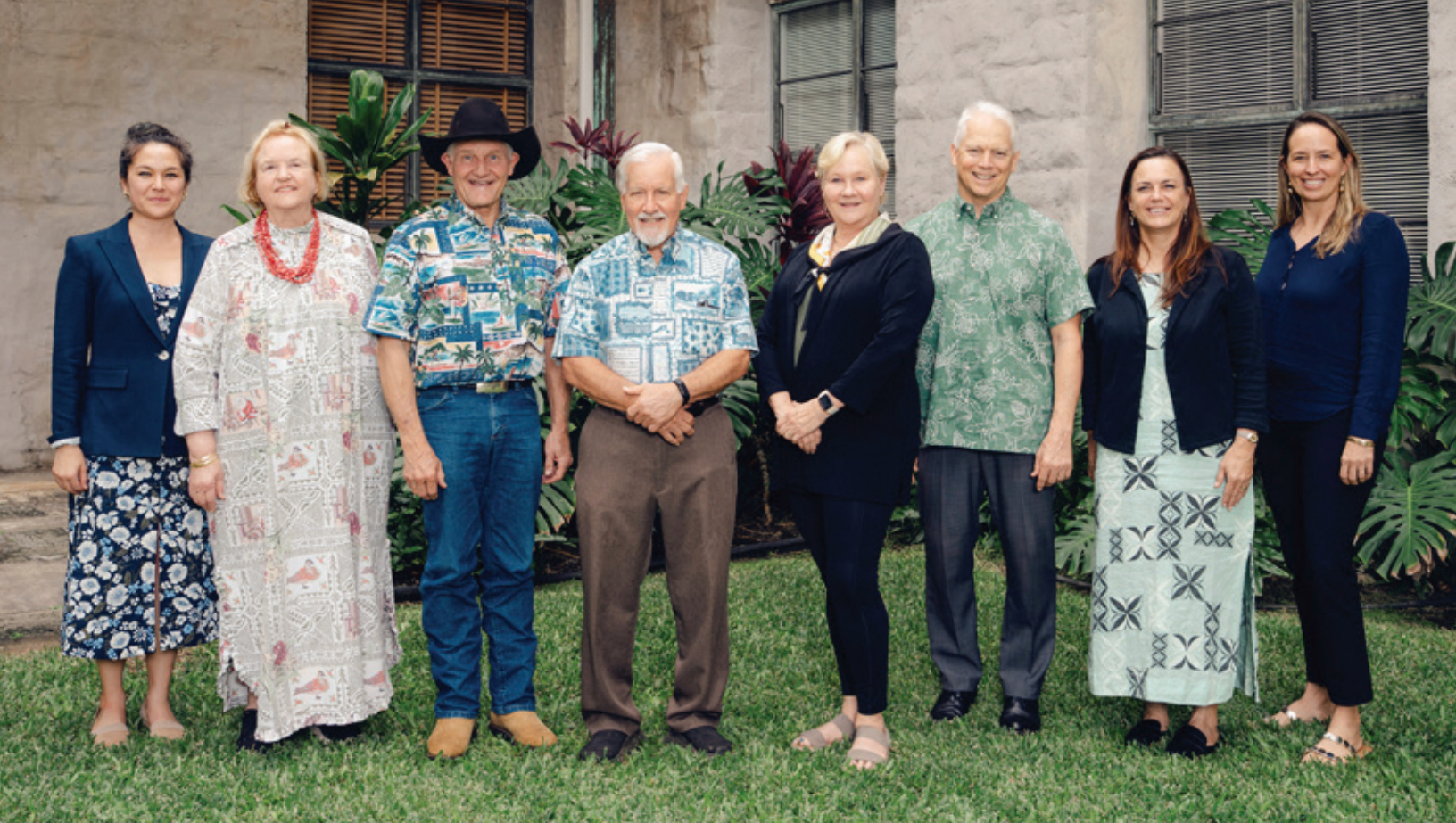

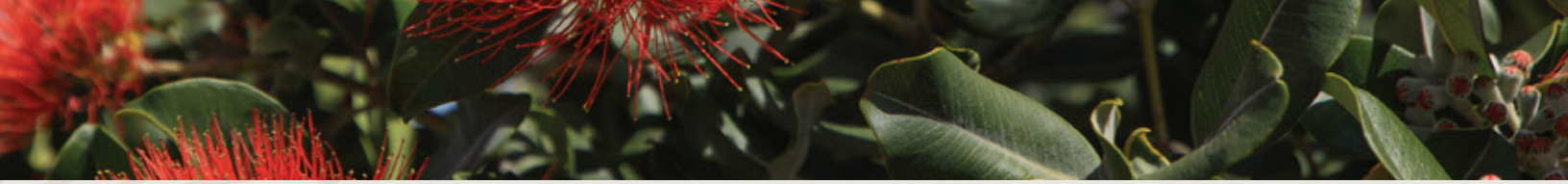

HISTORY OF THE ATHERTON FAMILY & FOUNDATION

JULIETTE M. ATHERTON

Juliette M. Atherton, the widow of Joseph B. Atherton, expressed her commitment to the welfare of the people of Hawai‘i with the creation of the Juliette M. Atherton Trust. On December 21, 1915, Mrs. Atherton transferred 20 percent of the outstanding shares of the Atherton Estate to her children, Charles H. Atherton, Mary A. Richards, and Frank C. Atherton. The 1,500 shares would be held in trust to continue the charitable work that Mrs. Atherton was vitally interested in throughout her life.

Mrs. Atherton originally retained the right to amend or revoke the trust. In 1921, the trust became an irrevocable charitable trust when she gave up her rights and amended the governing documents. This action was taken in recognition of the exemplary service performed by the trustees, and that they and succeeding trustees would perpetuate the trust’s philanthropic purposes as intended by Mrs. Atherton. The deed directed that the trust income be used for:

“...grants, loans, and other forms of payment toward assisting in the establishment, maintenance, or promotion of such religious, charitable, educational, benevolent, scientific, or other purposes, works, or enterprises, whether public or private, including schools, colleges, hospitals, asylums, homes, and the like institutions and objects for the public benefit, and including also the support and education of individuals during their attendance at any educational institution, and whether to corporations, associations, or other organizations or any private individual or individuals, as the Trustees shall in each case in their discretion and of their own volition approve.”

FRANK C. ATHERTON

Frank C. Atherton, business executive and philanthropist, was born in Honolulu on July 1, 1877. He was the son of industrialist Joseph B. Atherton and Juliette M. Atherton, daughter of pioneer American missionaries to Hawai‘i. Mr. Atherton attended Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut. Upon his return to Hawai‘i, he entered the world of finance and later became interested in industry. Like his forebears, he devoted much of his time to religious and civic works. On December 24, 1935, 10 years prior to his death, he established the Frank C. Atherton Trust to continue his support of religious, educational, and charitable programs and organizations. Grants and donations from the Frank C. Atherton Trust were primarily used to support charitable projects and programs in the state of Hawai‘i. In accordance with the purposes, expressed in the trust agreement, grants were for:

“...the making of donations, contributions, subscriptions, loans, and other forms of payment or toward assisting the establishment, maintenance and/or promotion of such religious, scientific, educational, and other charitable purposes and enterprises whether public or private, including churches, societies, schools, colleges, hospitals, asylums, homes, and like institutions and objects for the public benefit.”

Mr. Atherton appointed Eleanore S. Atherton, Marjory A. Wightman, and himself as Trustees.

HISTORY OF THE ATHERTON FAMILY & FOUNDATION

In 1975, the trustees of the Juliette M. Atherton Trust initiated action, which resulted in the creation of the Atherton Family Foundation, a nonprofit corporation organized in the state of Hawai‘i. A charter of incorporation was granted on November 4, 1975. The trustees then voted unanimously to transfer all investment property and income of the trust to the Atherton Family Foundation and transfer instruments were executed in January 1976. In December 1976, the trustees voted unanimously to transfer the property of the Frank C. Atherton Trust to the Atherton Family Foundation and executed appropriate instruments shortly thereafter.

Historically, the policies, the type of requests considered, and the primary fields of interest of the Juliette M. Atherton Trust and the Frank C. Atherton Trust were similar in nature. Both trusts considered educational programs and institutions the highest priority, and gave careful attention to religious organizations and health and social services.

The consolidation of the two trusts fulfilled several objectives: to provide more efficient administration, to allow greater flexibility in foundation policies, to increase protection and growth of the investment assets, and to increase the number of members and directors.

The diversity of the directors’ perceptions and experiences has enhanced the Foundation’s capacity to respond to the community and broadened its representation of charitable interests.

The Atherton Family Foundation is now one of the largest endowed grantmaking private resources in the state of Hawai‘i devoted exclusively to the support of charitable activities. It perpetuates the philanthropic commitment expressed during the lifetimes of Juliette M. Atherton and Frank C. Atherton, and of the family who have followed them.

2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITY THROUGH HEALTH

The Atherton Family Foundation continues its mission to support nonprofit organizations throughout Hawai‘i. In 2024, the Foundation awarded \$5.38 million in grants to organizations in a broad range of fields including nature conservation, arts and culture, youth development, and human services, to enhance Hawai‘i and the lives of its residents.

The Foundation’s commitment to increasing access to quality health care shone through in 2024. Grants were awarded for capital projects and programs around the state that served rural and urban populations, mothers, keiki, kūpuna, those with special needs, and those dealing with the effects of specific ailments such as cancer, Parkinson’s disease, and mental health challenges. By supporting healthcare efforts today, the Foundation helps build a stronger and healthier tomorrow.



2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

HEALTHY MOTHERS HEALTHY BABIES COALITION OF HAWAI'I

Healthy Mothers Healthy Babies Coalition of Hawai'i (HMHB) has been committed to health equity in Hawai'i for over thirty years. HMHB's programs focus on pregnant and parenting families while also providing healthcare access for people at all stages of life, prioritizing the needs of those at highest risk of poor health. HMHB serves the state through three office locations, a fleet of four mobile health clinics, and a telehealth service offered daily around the clock. Over 4,000 individuals benefit annually from HMHB's clinical care, mental health services, and peer-to-peer support, all offered through a community-based model that meets families where they are.

With an Atherton Family Foundation grant, HMHB was able to expand its "Mana Mama" telehealth program. Callers statewide receive support with a wide range of maternal and baby health needs through the hotline offered 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The top three needs of callers were mental health and postpartum depression support, breastfeeding assistance, and

social service supports such as cribs, diapers, and food. HMHB served 2,021 individuals with the grant funds, including providing mental health information and advice to 610 callers. While numbers are important, the tales of individuals show the true impact. A new mother called one night at the end of her rope, having tried everything to help her 9-week old infant breastfeed. After receiving information and skills from the Mana Mama telehealth team, the baby began feeding successfully. A worried mother became hopeful and full of joy—changing her relationship with her baby and the future for the better.





2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

KUMUKAHI HEALTH + WELLNESS

Hawai'i Island HIV/AIDS Foundation, dba Kumukahi Health + Wellness (KHW), was founded in 1993 in response to the AIDS crisis. It now provides public health insurance navigation, social services, and medical services for the Hawai'i Island community, particularly working with Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders, unsheltered persons, people dealing with substance abuse, the LGBTQ+ community, and those who are justice-involved. KHW serves the entire island of Hawai'i through offices in Hilo and Kona and is the primary standalone sexual health, infectious disease, and hormone replacement therapy care clinic on the island.

After occupying its Kona office for 8 years and seeing a 67% increase in demand for services, KHW had outgrown its current facilities. KHW needed new spaces to provide comfort and privacy for its patients, as well as space for group sessions and for staff to work and recuperate. A capital grant from the Atherton

Family Foundation enabled KHW to secure a larger, more functional space, as well as to renovate and furnish three new program rooms for medical services, testing, and counseling. KHW's clients now have smoother appointments and shorter wait times, and the staff have improved communication and greater pride in the healing space it offers. The Kona office expansion strengthens KHW's capacity to deliver confidential, culturally responsive, and comprehensive services that promote the physical, mental, and social well-being of West Hawai'i residents.





2024 YEAR IN REVIEW

WAHIAWĀ CENTER FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH

Wahiawā Center for Community Health (WCCH) serves the diverse community of Central O’ahu. This region has been designated by the federal Health Resources Services Administration as both a “Medically Underserved Population,” hosting groups who face economic, cultural or linguistic barriers to medical care, and as a “Health Professional Shortage Area.” With a mission rooted in aloha and compassion, WCCH provides family medicine, internal medicine, women’s health, pediatric services, diabetes care, behavioral health and psychiatric support, and additional medical services for its community members regardless of financial situation.

A 2024 grant from the Atherton Family Foundation helped WCCH expand its successful school-based healthcare model in the 2024-2025 school year. Two vans provided physical and mental health diagnoses and services for students, families, and school staff across the Leilehua-Mililani-Waialua School Complex. Screenings included assessments for behavioral health concerns such as depression, anxiety, and learning challenges, chronic

physical conditions screenings, and basic checks for vision, hearing, and dental health. 557 elementary through high school students received services, with WCCH providing 263 school and sports physicals and 228 depression screenings. These assessments not only led to medical help when needed but also provided the basis for school and academic supports in the classroom that otherwise might have been overlooked, while helping destigmatize mental health testing. Early identification of physical and mental health needs is key to the academic and personal success of keiki and ‘ōpio, with WCCH leading the way for this vibrant community.

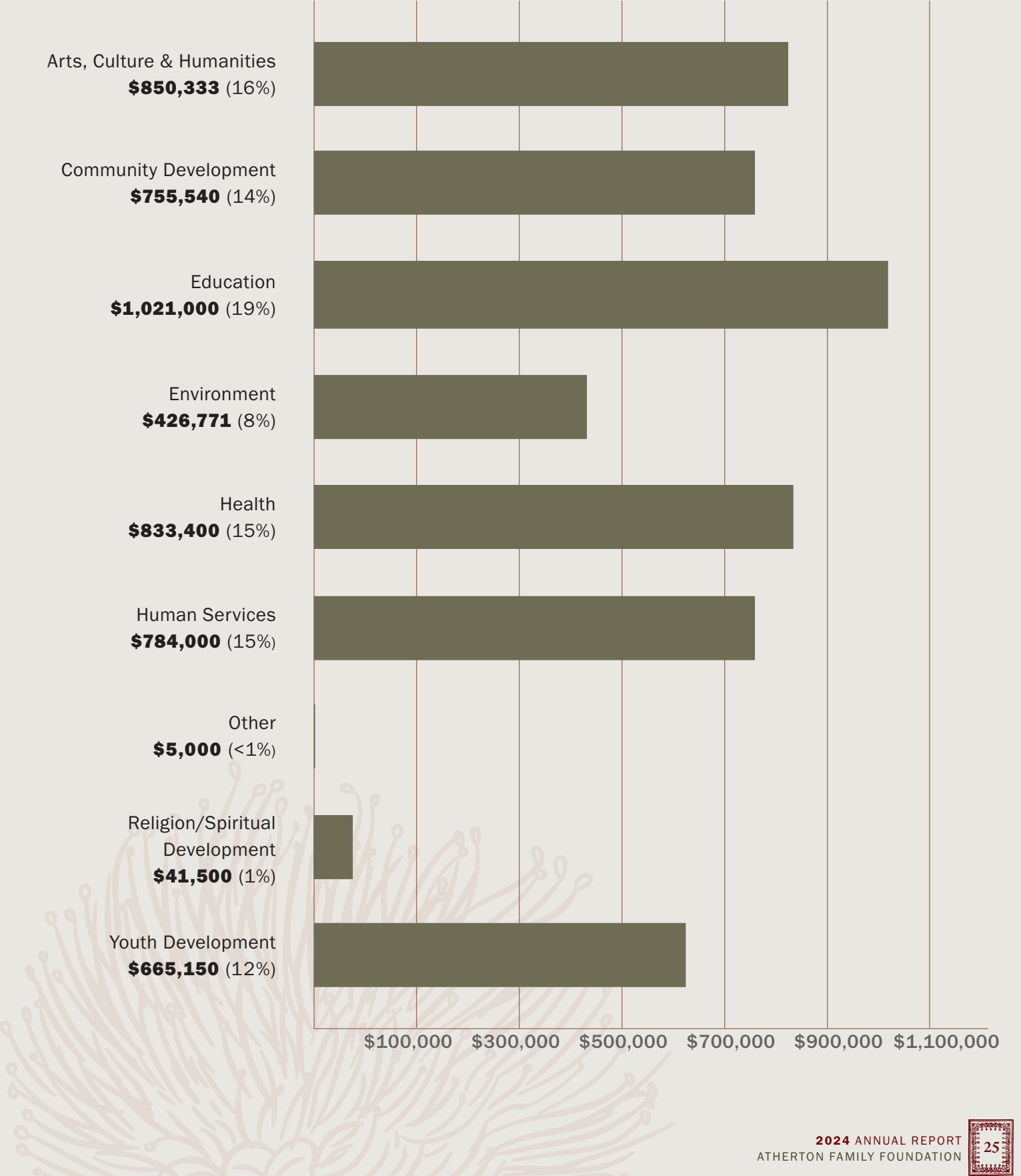

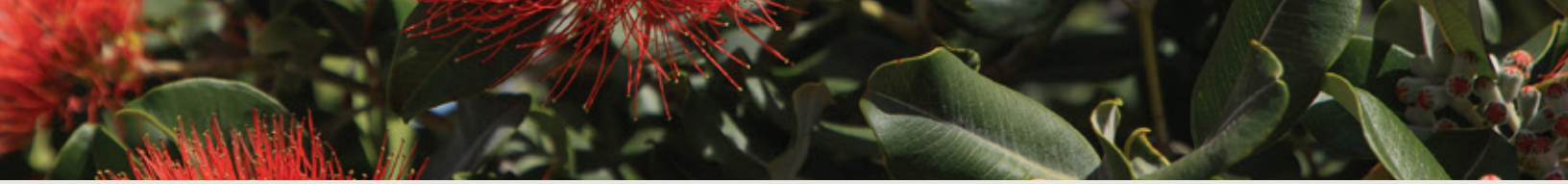

GRANT APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The Foundation makes grants for programs and projects that benefit the people of Hawai‘i. The fields of greatest interest are arts, culture and humanities; community development; education; environment; health; human services; spiritual development; and youth development.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Juliette M. Atherton Scholarship was named in memory of Mrs. Atherton to ensure the continued association of her name and her special interest in Christianity with the Foundation. The scholarship benefits three categories of individuals: dependent sons or daughters of ordained, active Protestant ministers in Hawai‘i pursuing undergraduate studies; individuals from Hawai‘i pursuing graduate theological studies at a Protestant seminary with the goal of ordination; and active, ordained Protestant ministers residing in Hawai‘i seeking an advanced degree. Scholarship recipients are selected based on their financial need and academic promise.

For the 2024-2025 academic year, scholarship awards totaled \$195,000 to 39 students. The Foundation also awarded a grant to support the Community Scholarship Fund of the Hawai‘i Community Foundation.

Applications will be available online beginning December 12, 2024, for the 2025-2026 academic year for seminary students, Protestant ministers pursuing advanced degrees, or sons and daughters of Protestant ministers. Application materials, including transcript of grades and essays must be submitted by February 28, 2025.

Advanced degree program applicants must provide the place and date of ordination, and the name of the seminary attended to confirm eligibility.
